### A Panel Discussion on Climate Change and the Oil and Gas Industry with Bob Inglis and Lila Ontiveros.

Moderated by Justin Lurie, Vice Chairman-API Houston Chapter



**Bob Inglis** is the Executive Director of republicEn.org. He was elected to the U.S. Congress in 1992, having never run for office before. He represented Greenville-Spartanburg, South Carolina, from 1993-1998, unsuccessfully challenged U.S. Senator Fritz Hollings in 1998, and then returned to the practice of commercial real estate law in Greenville, S.C. In 2004, he was re-elected to Congress and served until losing reelection in the South Carolina Republican primary of 2010. In 2011, Inglis went full-time into promoting free enterprise action on climate change and launched the Energy and Enterprise Initiative ("E&EI") at George Mason University in July 2012. In the fall of 2014, E&EI rebranded to become republicEn.org. republicEn is a growing grassroots community of over 10,000 Americans educating the country about free-enterprise solutions to climate change. The organization is a 501(c)(3) operation hosted at the George Mason University Foundation and educates, recruits and organizes conservative voices for action on climate change.



**Lila Ontiveros** is currently a Principal for CAZ Investments, and a Vice President at Freedom Solar -- the largest and oldest solar install company in Texas. Ms. Ontiveros manages Freedom Solar residential and commercial business in Houston. Ms. Ontiveros graduated from Phillips Exeter Academy and Cornell University. After graduation, she spent a decade at Goldman Sachs in New York on the foreign exchange trading desk, where she rose to the rank of Vice President. Ms. Ontiveros returned to her hometown of Houston to join the presidential campaign of Senator Ted Cruz as Finance Director. After returning to the private sector, Ms. Ontiveros has continued to serve at the national and local level as the board chair for 100 Women in Houston Who Give a Damn, a Stewardship Leadership Committee member at her church, St. Martin's Episcopal, a board member of the Teneo Network, advisory council member to Turning Point USA, advisory council member to Texas Parks Wildlife Stewards of the Wild, Mutton Bustin announcer at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo and a board member of the Texas Bowl. She was also a class agent for Phillips Exeter Academy for many years. Ms. Ontiveros is an avid hunter on multiple continents, and serves as an agent for the Ezulu Game Reserve in South Africa.
