NOTES:

The Houston Chapter's fiscal year is from July 1 to June 30 of the following year. Annual memberships are also effective from July 1 to June 30 of the following year.

1. Desk & Derrick Clubs and Society for Professional Women in Petroleum: Amounts shown include contributions for assisting with registration at the API Golf Tournaments, contributions to their annual scholarship funds, and funds they received for sponsoring and staffing "Par 3" Money Holes (40 % of funds collected) at the Golf Tournaments.
2. The Offshore Energy Center: \$12 ,000 was contributed during 1994-95 and 1995-96 for "startup funds". \$ 100,000 was pledged to the Offshore Energy Center during 1996-97 as an Underwriter Founding Organization and \$90,000 was contributed towards fulfilling the \$ 100,000 pledge prior to 2000-01.
The Offshore Energy Center's Educational Excellence Program: \$ 5,000 was contributed prior to 2000-01, \$ 10,000 during 2000-01, \$ 3,000 during 2002-03, and \$ 5,000 during 2003-04.
Audio self guided tour system: \$ 60,000 was pledged to install the system. Contributions of \$ 12,000, \$18,000, \$ 25,000 & \$ 5,000 were made in 2005, 2006, 2007 & 2008 respectively.
An additional \$10,197, for API logo wrist straps for the audio devices, and \$ 10,000 for repair of Hurricane "Ike" related damage was contributed in 2008-2009.
Contributions were made during 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-2012, 2012-2013, 2013-2014, and 2014-2015 to assist with improvements and enhancements to the museum.
3. Houston Independent School District's High School for the Engineering Professions: Contributions were for college scholarships for graduating Senior class students in 2009-10 through 2014-15, and \$2,366 was for a field trip in December 2015 for Senior Class students to the Offshore Energy Center in Galveston.
4. The Craft & Hawkins Department of Petroleum Engineering at Louisiana State University, and Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas: Non-endowed contributions for student scholarships
5. National Energy Education Development (NEED) : Sponsored twelve (12) school teachers attendance at the NEED conference in Galveston in July 2002, 2003, 2004, & 2008. The 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 conferences were moved to other cities.
6. Honorarium contributions: \$ 100.00 contributions to various charitable organizations selected by guest speakers, in lieu of mementos previously given to those speakers.
7. Memorial Contribution to honor Mr. Clyde J. Perrere, a former API Chapter Chairman in 1974 - 1975, and a very active member of the API Houston Chapter Board for more than 40 years.
8. Boy Scouts of America: Contributions made for cleanup after the 1999 Sporting Clays Tournament at "Baroid on the Brazos", and for 2003 and 2007 Scout projects.
9. The University of Texas, M. D. Anderson Cancer Center: Established a dedicated fund for mesothelioma cancer research in honor of a former API Board member and the wife of a former Chapter Chairman who both died from that disease. Additional contributions have been made for breast cancer research as a memorial for another former Chapter Chairman's wife.
10. Texas Tech University Capital Fund for construction of new facilities for the Petroleum Engineering Department. Includes new classroom and laboratory buildings.
11. Contributions were made to sponsor a table at the 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 Oilfield Christian Prayer Breakfasts at the OTC.
